

If you want to find this monument, you will have to climb a little, between trees and flowers. João Vaz Corte Real built his first castle here – “Castelo dos Moinhos”. Today’s monument was built in 1856 to pay homage to the visit of King Pedro IV to the island during the Portuguese Civil War. From here you will have an extraordinary view of Angra. Have you guessed where to go? No? One more clue, look for an obelisk...

You will have to find a church that was built on the place where the first hospital in the Azores was founded, in 1492. This hospital treated the poor, but also sick people that arrived on the island after long journeys at sea. After many changes, the church you are looking for was inaugurated, in 1746. In the 19th century, the hospital was moved to another place. Look for a Baroque style church with a central nave, surrounded by two bell towers, decorated in white and blue, near the sea.

Another church... 1491, Álvaro Martins Homem built a small church and dedicated it to the Holy Saviour. In 1534, Pope Paul III designated this place as the religious seat, created the diocese of the Azores. It took a long time and lots of hindrances to see this cathedral as we know it today. In the 1950's, this simplified cathedral was born. The 1980 earthquake caused extensive damage to the building, but it was rebuilt. In 1985, a big fire destroyed a part of the altars, but Angra's people rebuilt it again. Have you guessed where to go? The street has the name of the monument.



Not a church, not even a monument, just a historical place. Find an old primary school located at one end of the old town. Its name recalls the dozens of excavated wheat pits here in the form of large carvings of wide bulge, taking advantage of the dry and compact terrain of volcanic tuff. Each hole had an owner who covered it with a circular stone, often with his initials. The chronicles say that the wheat here made the best bread in the Azores. Can you guess?



All ships that were returning from Africa, America and India came to this port during the 16th and 17th centuries. It was the gate to the city of Angra, the place to pay taxes and to control all the cargoes. Have you guessed? Try this clue...Find one of the most famous sailors in history. In 1499, when his fleet was on its way back to Lisbon from the voyage to India, he disembarked on the island with a lot of sick men, including his brother, Paulo da Gama who died on the island and was buried here.



This manor house, also known as “Solar do Provedor das Armadas” was built by Pero Anes do Canto with the purpose of serving both as his own home and as a facility to assist the King’s Navy. Today, the building belongs to the Regional Government of the Azores. It’s located in “Corpo Santo” and from there you have a perfect view to the port and also easy access to it.





INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 - Each team can ask anyone on the street for directions, except teachers or students participating in the project.**
- 2 – Each time you find a place, you will have to take a selfie with the team and the monument to prove you were there.**
- 3 – After collecting the 6 monuments come back to the starting point. The first team to arrive with the 6 monuments collected wins a surprise prize.**
- 4 – Two of your team members must use OSC and Mapillary.**
